Declaration of Faith—WE BELIEVE

- 1. In the verbal inspiration of the Bible.
- 2. In one God eternally existing in three persons; namely the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.
- 3. That Jesus Christ is the only begotten Son of the Father, conceived of the Holy Ghost, and born to the Virgin Mary. That Jesus was crucified, buried, and raised from the dead; that He ascended to heaven and is today at the right hand of the Father as the Intercessor.
- 4. That all have sinned and come short of the glory of God, and that repentance is commanded by God for all and necessary for forgiveness of sins.
- 5. That justification, regeneration, and the new birth are wrought by faith in the blood of Jesus Christ
- 6. In sanctification subsequent to the new birth, through faith in the blood of Christ: through the Word, and by the Holy Ghost.
- 7. Holiness is God's standard of living for his people.
- 8. In the baptism of the Holy Ghost subsequent to a clean heart.
- 9. In speaking with other tongues as the spirit give utterance, and that it is the initial evidence of the baptism of the Holy Ghost.
- 10. In water baptism by immersion and that all who repent should be baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.
- 11. Divine healing is provided for all in the atonement.
- 12. In the Lord's Supper and washing of the saints' feet.
- 13. In the premillennial Second Coming of Jesus. First, to resurrect in the air. Second, to reign on the earth a thousand years.
- 14. In bodily resurrection: eternal life for the righteous and eternal punishment for the wicked.
- 15. This event is the blessed hope set before us in Scripture, and for this we should be constantly looking (John 14:1-3; I Corinthians 15:51, 52; Philippians 3:20; I Thessalonians 4:13-18; Titus 2:11-14; I Thessalonians 1:10; Revelation 3:10)
